SUBJECT: Request for Material and Product Substitution

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Product / Material substitutions **shall be submitted to the Prequalified General Contractor** who attended the mandatory pre-bid meeting and job walk. Substitutions shall be in accordance with Section 00700, General Conditions for Contracts for Construction, Article 3, Section 3.11 – Shop Drawings, Product Data, and Samples. The District shall not entertain any product or material substitution requests coming directly from subcontractors or material suppliers.

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SECTION 00700

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR CONTRACTS FOR CONSTRUCTION

ARTICLE 3, SECTION 3.11, SHOP DRAWINGS, PRODUCT DATA, AND SAMPLES

3.11.4 Substitutions

3.11.4.1 One Product Specified. Unless the Specifications state that no substitution is permitted, whenever the Contract Documents indicate any specific article, device, equipment, product, material, fixture, patented process, form, method, or type of construction or any specific name, make, trade name, or catalog number, with or without the words "or equal," such specification shall be deemed to be used for the purpose of facilitating description of the material, process, or article desired and shall be deemed to be followed by the words "or equal." Pursuant to Paragraph 3.11.4.3, the Contractor may, unless otherwise stated, offer any material, process, article, etc., which shall be materially equal or better in every respect to that so indicated or specified ("Specified Item") and will completely accomplish the purpose of the Contract Documents.

3.11.4.2 Products Specified Which are Commercially Unavailable. If the Contractor fails to make a request for substitutions for products, prior to the submission of its bid, and such products subsequently become commercially unavailable, the Contractor may request a substitution for such commercially unavailable item. The decision to grant this request is solely at the District's discretion. The written approval of the District, consistent with the procedure for Change Orders, shall be required for the use of a proposed substitute material. The District may condition its approval of the substitution upon the delivery to District of an extended warranty or other assurances of adequate performance of the substitution as well as an equitable deduction in the contract price should the substituted item cost less than the Specified Item. All risks of delay due the approval of a requested substitution by the DSA, or any other governmental agency having jurisdiction, shall be on the requesting party. All additional costs, all procurement and construction delays, and all costs for review by the Architect or its consultants shall be the responsibility of the Contractor and will be deducted from Contractor's pay request.

3.11.4.3 Substitution Request Form Requests for substitutions of products, materials, or processes in place of a Specified Item must in writing on the District's Substitution Request Form ("Request Form") at the time of submitting bids to the District, except as provided for in Paragraph 3.11.4.2.

The Request Form must be accompanied by evidence as to whether the proposed substitution:

1. Is equal in quality/service/ability to the Specified Item;
2. Will entail no changes in detail, construction, and scheduling of related work;
3. Will be acceptable in consideration of the required design and artistic effect;
4. Will provide no cost disadvantage to the District;

5. Will require no excessive or more expensive maintenance, including adequacy and availability of replacement parts; and
6. Will required no change of the construction schedule.

In completing the Request Form, the bidder must state, with respect to each requested substitution, whether the bidder will agree to provide the Specified Item in the event that the District denies the bidder's request for such requested substitution. In the event that the bidder has agreed in the Request Form to provide the Specified Item and the District denies the bidder's requested substitution for a Specified Item, the bidder shall provide the Specified Item without any additional cost or charge to the District.

After bids are opened, the apparent lowest bidder shall provide, within five (5) days of opening such bids, any and all Drawing, Specifications, samples, performance data, calculations, and other information, as may be required to assist the Architect and the District in determining whether the proposed substitution is acceptable. The burden of establishing these facts shall be upon the bidder.

After the District's receipt of such evidence by the bidder, the District will make its final decision as to whether the bidder's request for substitution for any Specified Items will be granted. The decision as to whether a proposed request for substitution is equal to a Specified Item shall be at the sole discretion of the District. Any request for substitution that is granted by the District shall be documented and processed through a Change Order. The District may condition its approval of any substitution upon delivery to the District of an extended warranty or other assurances of adequate performance of the substitution. Any and all risks of delay due to approval by the DSA or any other governmental agency having jurisdiction shall be on the bidder.

If the Architect and District accept a proposed substitution, the Contractor agrees to pay for all engineering and design services, including, without limitation, compensation to the Architect and affected engineers for their required time to process such substitution through the Division of the State Architect, if required, and to make all changes and adjustments in materials or the work of all trades directly or indirectly affected by the substituted item or items at no cost to the District.

3.11.4.4 List of Manufacturers and Products Required. The Contractor shall require all Subcontractors to prepare and submit to the Contractor, within thirty (30) days of execution of the Subcontract, comprehensive lists, in quadruplicate, of the manufacturers and products proposed for the Project, including information on materials, equipment, and fixtures required by the Contract Documents, as may be required for the Contractor's or Architect's approval. Approval of such lists of products shall not be construed as a substitute for the shop drawings, manufacturer's descriptive data, and samples, required by the Contract Documents, but rather shall be considered as a base from which more detailed submittals shall be developed for final review by the Contractor and the Architect.

3.11.5 Deferred Approvals

Deferred approvals shall be submitted and processed pursuant to the requirements of Division 1 of the Specifications. All deferred approvals shall be prepared by Contractor or Contractor's agent early enough so as to not delay the Project. Contractor is aware that Title 21 California Code of Regulations Section 17(g) and Title 24 California Code of Regulations Section 4-317 have specific requirements for

deferred approval as to governing agencies and as to the Architect and Engineer for the Project. As a result, any delay associated with the time for approval by applicable agencies or by the Architect or Architect's consultants shall be Contractor's.

PRODUCT OPTIONS AND SUBSTITUTIONS

PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 RELATED DOCUMENTS

- A. All Contract Documents shall be reviewed for applicable provisions related to the provisions in this document, and provisions in the General Conditions and other Division 0 and Division 1 Specification Sections shall apply to this Section without limitation.

1.3 SUMMARY

- A. This Section includes administrative and procedure requirements for selecting products for use in Project; included but are not limited to: product product delivery and shipping requirements, storage and handling, manufacturer’s standard warranties on products; special warranties; product substitutions; and comparable products.

1.4 DEFINITIONS

- A. **Products:** Items purchased for incorporating into the Work, whether purchased for Project or taken from previously purchased stock. The term "product" includes the terms "material," "equipment," "system," and terms of similar intent.
 - 1. **Named Products:** Items identified by manufacturer's product name, including make or model number, or other designation shown or listed in manufacturer's published product literature that is current as of date of the Contract Documents.
 - 2. **New Products:** Items that have not previously been incorporated into another project or facility, except that products consisting of recycled-content materials are allowed, unless explicitly stated otherwise. Products salvaged or recycled from other projects are not considered new products.
 - 3. **Do not use materials and equipment removed from existing premises, except as specifically permitted by the Contract Documents.**
- B. **Options:**
 - 1. **For products specified only by reference standard:** Select any product meeting that standard.
 - 2. **For products specified by naming one or more products or manufacturers:**
 - a. **Select products of any named manufacturer meeting specifications.**
 - b. **If product becomes unavailable due to no fault of Contractor, submit Request for Substitution (RFS), including all information contained in this Section 01625.**
 - 3. **Products Specified by Naming Several Manufacturers:** Products of named manufacturers meeting specifications; no substitutions of products by other manufacturers allowed.
 - 4. **Products Specified by Naming Only One Manufacturer:** No option due to necessity to match existing products or systems, no substitutions allowed.
- C. **Substitutions:** Changes in products, materials, equipment, and methods of construction from those required by the Contract Documents and proposed by Contractor after award of the Contract.

1.5 SUBSTITUTION REQUIREMENTS

- A. **Except as provided in Document (Request for Proposals) with respect to "or equal" items, District will consider Contractor's substitution requests only when product becomes unavailable due to no fault of Contractor. Requests for review of proposed substitute items will not be accepted from anyone other than Contractor. The RFS shall state the extent, if any, to which the evaluation and acceptance of the proposed substitute will prejudice Contractor's achievement of Substantial Completion on time, and whether or not acceptance of the substitute for use in the Work will require a change in any of the Contract Documents (or in the provisions of any other direct contract with District for work on the Project.)**
- B. **Product List:** Submit a list, in tabular form, showing specified products. Include generic names of products required. Include manufacturer's name and proprietary product names for each product.
- C. **Coordinate product list with Contractor's Construction Schedule and the Submittals Schedules.**
- D. **Submit separate RFS (and nine copies) for each product and support each request with:**
 - 1. **Product identification, including specification section number, and title.**

2. **Manufacturer's literature, including data info, and specifications.**
 3. **Samples, as applicable, including actual samples, and color chart as applicable.**
 4. **Name and address of similar projects on which product has been used, and dates of installation.**
 5. **Name, address, and telephone number of supplier, installer, and manufacturer's representative or sales engineer.**
 6. **For construction methods: Detailed description of proposed method; drawings illustrating methods.**
 7. **Provide projected delivery date or time span of delivery period.**
- E. Contractor shall provide itemize a comparison of the proposed substitution with product specified and list significant variations including, but not limited to dimensions, weights, service requirements and functional differences. If variation from product specified is not pointed out in submittal, variation will be rejected even though submittal was favorable reviewed. Identify all variations of the proposed substitute from that specified in the RFS and indicate available maintenance, repair, and replacement service.**
- F. Contractor shall state whether the substitute will require a change in any of the Contract Documents (or provisions of any other direct contract with District for work on the Project) to adapt the design of the proposed substitute, and whether or not incorporation or use of the substitute in connection with proposed substitute, and whether or not incorporation or use of the substitute in connection with Work is subject to payment of any license fee or royalty. Submit data relating to changes in construction schedule.**
- G. Contractor shall provide accurate cost data comparing proposed substitution with product and amount of net change in Contract Sum including, but not limited to, an itemized estimate of all costs or credits that will result directly or indirectly from acceptance of such substitute, including costs of redesign and claims of other contractors affected by the resulting change, all of which will be considered by Architect, Project Manager, and District in evaluating the proposed substitute. Architect, Project Manager or District may require Contractor to furnish additional data about the proposed substitute.**
- H. Architect, Project Manager, or District will not consider substitution for acceptance (or, in District's sole discretion, District may make Contractor sole responsible for all resulting costs, expenses and other consequences) when a substitution:**
1. **Results in delay meeting construction Milestones or completion dates.**
 2. **Is indicated or implied on submittals without formal request from Contractor.**
 3. **Is requested directly by Subcontractor or supplier.**
 4. **Acceptance will require substantial revision of Contract Documents.**
 5. **Disrupts Contractor's job rhythm or ability to perform efficiently.**
- I. Substitute products shall be ordered without written acceptance of Architect, and District.**
- J. Architect, Project Manager or District shall determine acceptability of proposed substitutions and reserve right to reject proposals due to insufficient information.**
- K. Accepted substitutions will be evidenced by a Change Order. All Contract Documents requirements apply to work involving substitutions.**

1.6 CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATION AND WARRANTY

- A. Contractor's RFS constitute a representation and warranty that Contractor complies with the following requirements:
 - 1. Has investigated proposed product and determined that it meets or exceeds, in all respects, specified product.
 - 2. Shall provide the same warranty for substitution as for specified product.
 - 3. Shall coordinate installation and make other changes that may be required for Work to be complete in all respects.
 - 4. Waives claims for additional costs which may subsequently become apparent.
 - 5. Shall compensate District for additional redesign and/or DSA costs associated with substitution.
 - 6. Shall be responsible for Construction Schedule slippage due to substitution.
 - 7. Shall be responsible for construction Schedule delay due to late ordering of available specified products caused by requests for substitution that are subsequently rejected by District.
 - 8. Shall compensate District for all costs; including extra costs for performing Work under Contract Documents, extra cost to other contractors, and any claims brought against District, caused by late requests for substitutions or late ordering of products.

1.7 ARCHTECT'S ACTION

- A. Architect shall respond in writing to Contractor within (15) working days of receipt of completed product list. Architect's response shall include a list of unacceptable product selections and a brief explanation of reasons for this action. Architect's response, or lack of response, does not constitute a waiver of requirement to comply with the Contract Documents.
- B. Architect shall notify Contractor in writing of decision to accept or reject Contractor's requested substitution.
- C. If necessary, Architect shall request additional information or documentation for evaluation within (5) working days of receipt of a request for substitution. Architect shall notify Contractor of acceptance or rejection of proposed substitution within (15) working days of receipt of request, or (5) working days of receipt of additional information of documentation, whichever is later.

1.8 ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

- A. Specified products, materials, or systems for Project may include engineering or on-file standards required by the regulatory agency. Contractor's substitution of products, materials or systems may require additional engineering, testing, reviews, approvals, assurances, or other information for compliance with regulatory agency requirements or both. Provide all agency approvals or other additional information required and pay additional costs for required District services made necessary by the substitution at no increase in Contract Sum or Contract time, and as a part of substitution proposal.
- B. Documentation: Show compliance with requirements for substitutions and the following, as applicable:
 - 1. Statement indicating why specified material or product cannot be provided.

2. Coordination information, including a list of changes or modifications needed to other parts of the Work and to construction performed by District and separate contractors that will be necessary to accommodate proposed substitution.
3. Detailed comparison of significant qualities of proposed substitution with those of the Work specified. Significant qualities may include attributes such as performance, weight, size, durability, visual effect, and specific features and requirements indicated.
4. Product Data, including drawings and descriptions of products and fabrication and installation procedures.
5. Samples, where applicable or requested.
6. List of similar installations for completed projects with project names and addresses and names and addresses of Architects and District.
7. Material test reports from a qualified testing agency indicating and interpreting test results for compliance with requirements indicated.
8. Research/evaluation reports evidencing compliance with building code in effect for Project, from a model code organization acceptable to authorities have jurisdiction.
9. Detailed comparison of Contractor's Construction Schedule using proposed substitution with products specified for the Work, including effect on the overall Contract Time. If specified product or method of construction cannot be provided within Contract Time, include letter from manufacturer, on manufacturer's letterhead, stating lack of availability or delays in delivery.
10. Complete breakdown of costs indicating the cost amount to be added to or deducted from the Contract Sum if the proposed substitution is accepted.
11. Contractor's certification that proposed substitution complies with requirements in the Contract Documents.
12. Contractor's waiver of rights to additional payment or time that may subsequently become necessary because of failure of proposed substitution to produce indicated results.

1.9 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- A. Compatibility of Options: If Contractor is given option of selecting between two or more products for use on project, product selected shall be compatible with products previously selected, even if previously selected products were also options.
 1. Contractor shall be responsible for providing products and construction means and methods compatible with products and construction means and methods of other contractors.
 2. If a dispute arises between Contractors over concurrently selectable but incompatible products, Architect and District shall determine which products shall be used.

1.10 PRODUCT DELIVERY AND HANDLING REQUIREMENTS

- A. Deliver, store, and handle products using means and methods that will prevent damage, deterioration, and loss, including theft. Comply with manufacturer's written instructions.
- B. Delivery and handling:

1. Schedule delivery to minimize long-term storage at project site and to prevent overcrowding of construction spaces.
 2. Coordinate delivery with installation time to ensure minimum holding time for items that are flammable, hazardous, easily damaged, or sensitive to deterioration, theft, and other losses.
 3. Deliver products to Project site in an undamaged condition in manufacturer's original sealed container or other packaging system, complete with intact and legible labels and instructions for handling, storing, unpacking, protecting, and installing.
- C. Deliver products in accordance with manufacturer's instructions.
- D. Promptly inspect shipments to assure that products comply with requirements, quantities are correct, and products are undamaged.

1.11 SHIPPING REQUIREMENTS

- A. Preparation for Shipment: All equipment shall be suitably packaged to facilitate handling and to protect against damage during transit and storage. All equipment shall be boxed, crated, or otherwise completely enclosed and protected during shipment, handling, and storage. All equipment shall be protected from exposure to the elements and shall be kept dry at all times.
1. Painted and coated surfaces shall be protected against impact, abrasion, discoloration, and other damage. Painted and coated surfaces which are damaged prior to acceptance of equipment shall be repainted to the satisfaction of Architect and District.
 2. Grease and lubricating oil shall be applied to all bearings and similar items.
- B. Shipping: Before shipping each item of equipment shall be tagged or marked as identified in the delivery schedule or on the Shop Drawings. Complete packing lists and bills of material shall be included with each shipment.

1.12 PRODUCT STORAGE AND HANDLING REQUIREMENTS

- A. Store products only in staging area per Contract Documents and Phasing.
- B. Handle, store, and protect products in accordance with manufacturer's instructions, with seals and labels intact and legible. Store sensitive products in weather-tight, climate-controlled enclosures.
- C. For exterior storage of fabricated products, place on appropriate supports, above ground.
- D. Cover products subject to deterioration with impervious sheet covering. Provide ventilation to avoid condensation.
- E. Store loose granular materials on solid flat surfaces in a well-drained area.
- F. Provide equipment and personnel to store products by methods to prevent soiling, disfigurement, or damage.
- G. Arrange storage of products to permit access for inspection. Periodically inspect to assure products are undamaged and are maintained under specified conditions.

H. Without limiting the foregoing:

1. Contractor shall bear the responsibility for delivery of equipment, spare parts, special tools, and materials to the Site and shall comply with the requirements specified herein and provide required information concerning the shipment and delivery of the materials specified in Contract Documents. These requirements also apply to any sub-suppliers making direct shipments to the Site. Acceptance of the equipment shall be made only after it is installed, tested, placed in operation and found to comply with all the specified requirements.
2. All items shall be checked against packing lists immediately on delivery to the Site for damage and for shortages. Damage and shortages shall be remedied with the minimum of delay.
3. No metalwork (miscellaneous steel shapes and reinforcing steel) shall be stored directly on the ground. Masonry products shall be handled and stored in a manner to hold breakage, chipping, cracking, and spalling to a minimum. Cement, lime, and similar products shall be stored off the ground on pallets and shall be covered and kept completely dry at all times. Pipe fittings and valves may be stored out of doors, but must be placed on wooden blocking. PVC pipe, geomembranes, plastic liner, and other plastic materials shall be stored off the ground on pallets and protected from direct sunlight.
4. Electrical equipment and all equipment with antifriction or sleeve bearings shall be stored in weather-tight structures maintained at a temperature above 60 degree Fahrenheit. Electrical equipment controls, and insulation shall be protected against moisture and water damage. All space heaters furnished in equipment shall be connected and operated continuously.
5. Equipment have moving parts such as gears, bearings, and seals, shall be stored fully lubricated with oil, grease, etc., unless otherwise instructed by the manufacturer. Manufacturer's storage instructions shall be carefully followed by Contractor.
6. When required by the equipment manufacturer, moving parts shall be rotated a minimum of twice a month to ensure proper lubrication and to avoid metal to metal "welding". Upon installation of the equipment, Contractor shall, at the discretion of Architect and District, start the equipment at one-half load for an adequate period of time to ensure that the equipment does not deteriorate from lack of use.
7. When required by the equipment manufacturer, lubricant shall be changed upon completion of installation and as frequently as required thereafter during the period between installation and acceptance. New lubricants shall be put into the equipment by Contractor at the time of acceptance.
8. Equipment and materials shall not show any pitting, rust, decay, or other deleterious effects of storage when installed in the Work.
9. In addition to the protection specified for prolonged storage, the packaging of spare units and spare parts shall be for export packing and shall be suitable for long-term storage in a damp location. Each spare item shall be packed separately and shall be completely identified on the outside of the container.
10. Handling: Stored items shall be laid out to facilitate their retrieval for use in the Work. Care shall be taken when removing the equipment for use to ensure the precise piece of equipment is removed and that it is handled in a manner that does not damage the equipment.

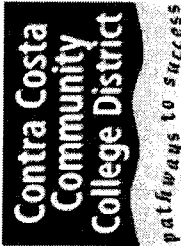

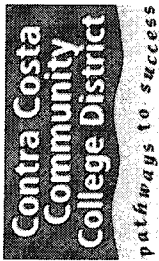
